TUTORIAL PROGRAM HANDOUT: Additional Sample Questions**

PROBLEM SENSITIVITY: QUESTION TYPE 2

According to department regulations, police officers will NOT make notifications to the relatives of a victim who is killed or injured in an accident, without the permission of the supervisor in charge.

Consider the following situation:

A victim is seriously injured in an auto accident and the first police officer on the scene immediately calls the injured victim's wife to tell her which hospital her husband is being taken to. In this case, the action of the police officer is:

- A. proper, because it follows the notification policy.
- B. proper, because the next of kin should always be notified in cases involving the hospitalization of victims.
- C. improper, because the police officer does not have the authority to make such a notification.
- D. improper, because the police officer should have notified the victim's wife in person.

INDUCTIVE REASONING: QUESTION TYPE 1

Three shoplifting incidents occurred in the town of Strathmore over a two-week period. On each occasion, a suspect was spotted running from the store with merchandise. The description of each suspect is presented below:

Incident 1 (May 6) - male, White, early 30s, about 5'9", approximately 160 pounds, long blonde hair, mustache and beard, large scar on face, blue jeans and blue t-shirt.

Incident 2 (May 14) - male, White, maybe 35, about 5'9" and 165 pounds, short blonde hair, clean shaven, large scar on face, grey pants and grey shirt.

Incident 3 (May 16) - male, White, 30-32, about 5'9", maybe 160 pounds, bald, clean shaven, large scar on face, black pants, and black t-shirt.

On May 17, a fourth shoplifting incident occurs and a suspect is once again spotted. This suspect's description is presented below:

Incident 4 (May 17) - male, White, around 33, about 5'9", approximately 160 pounds, bald, clean shaven, large scar on face, black pants, and green shirt.

Based upon the description of the suspects in the first three incidents, the suspect in incident 4 should also be considered a suspect in incident(s):

- A. 2 only.
- B. 3 only.
- C. 2 and 3 only.
- D. 1, 2, and 3.

INFORMATION ORDERING: QUESTION TYPE 1

Use the information in the following passage to answer the next question.

All police officers are advised that if a summons is lost, mutilated, or must be voided due to an error, these steps must be followed in the order given:

- 1) Prepare a memorandum with a routing slip addressed to the Shift Commander including shield number, ticket number and explanation of the loss, mutilation, or circumstances surrounding the voided summons.
- 2) Attach any remaining parts of the summons to your memorandum.
- 3) Submit the memorandum and attachments to your station supervisor.
- 4) Keep a copy of your memorandum on file.
- 5) Destroy your copy of the memorandum when you receive the replacement summons.

Officer Bryant has just picked up a new batch of summons and realizes that the first one was printed incorrectly. Officer Bryant prepares a memorandum including her shield number, the ticket number, and an explanation of the circumstances. According to the preceding passage, the police officer's next step should be to:

- A. destroy her copy of the memorandum.
- B. submit the memorandum to the station supervisor.
- C. keep a copy of the memorandum on file.
- D. attach the misprinted summons to the memorandum.
